
Dear Pre-K Families,

4th & 5th Grade

The month of May is quickly approaching. The following are some highlights of what the class worked on in April as well as some activities your child will be working on in May. In ELA, the students have created writing pieces using onomatopoeias, idioms, tongue twisters, and alliteration. Using these words or phrases in their writing gives them a sensory effect that they can use to create a vivid imagery. They have also been working on opinion statements. This encourages them to share a point of view that includes detailed supportive reasons for their opinions. Next month, the students will be having a debate on a real-world topic or issue. In reading, the students are engrossed in the novel "Wonder". They have not only been writing daily reflections on concerns that arise in this novel but also have been fact storming by comparing/contrasting, sequencing events, and analyzing the characters. Next month, we might be able to squeeze in a couple of short stories. You can't have enough of good literature. In math, the students are working on GCF, area, volume, angles, converting fractions, multiplying decimals, and average. During math time I try to strive and demonstrate to the students that math can be useful, exciting, engaging, and fun. Next month, we will be working on economics and finances in the form of formulas, models, understanding interest, tax, savings and graphs. The students will be creating a financial goals poster. In science, the students have been working on earth's atmosphere, air masses and fronts, greenhouse effects, climates, and the water cycles. In lab, they created "clouds", edible earth rounds, and weather instruments. Alongside these great activities the students were overjoyed to be a part of hatching chicks. They documented and observed daily the process and development and were so excited when they were able to witness the chicks hatch from their eggs. What a true blessing and a great way to learn about the life cycle of an organism. Next month, the students will be working on astronomy. We will be studying everything in the universe and beyond Earth's atmosphere. The students will be creating a model of the solar system. In social studies, the students are learning about the Presidency of Abraham Lincoln, Emancipation Proclamation, and the Civil War. We discuss how the Civil War paved the way for Americans to live, learn and move about in ways that had seemed all but inconceivable just a few years earlier. In fine arts, the students are "meeting the artists", they are creating pieces using the artists techniques. We have begun learning about Diego Rivera and his mural the "Allegory of California" and Jackson Pollock's abstract piece an "Autumn Rhythm." The students created a large mural to represent El Paso, Texas. It includes Mount Cristo Rey, the Star on the mountain, Rio Grande, the Tramway, El Paso Zoo, and the Franklin Mountains. The mural incorporated all the student's creativity and uniqueness. Next month, we will continue to learn about other famous artists and their contribution to the world of art. Finally, the students prepared an amazing Easter brunch. They made pancakes made from scratch, scrambled eggs, and sausages. What great chefs, the food was delicious. I would like to wish all the mothers/grandmothers a very Happy Mother's Day. Thank you for allowing me to be a part of your child's school year.
