A WORD FROM OUR DIRECTOR

Dear Western Hills Academy,

We have great students and parents! Thank you for all that you do to make our community an awesome one! I wish to report that we have increased the current enrollment because of your excellent references. Also, we are almost at capacity for the next school year, and we are excited about all the wonderful memories we will make!

We have great teachers and staff that have servant's hearts and continue to create extraordinary learning experiences for your children. They provide your child with memorable lessons and enjoy their students' voices and smiles. Several teachers have offered up their time to provide summer camp opportunities for your children this June. We are blessed to have such dedicated teachers!

I am happy to report that we will be upgrading some overdue facility maintenance to our classrooms in July. We will be painting our indoor spaces, upgrading furniture, installing new toilets, and improving ventilation and technology...over \$100,000 in improvements. To help with the costs, I applied and was awarded \$51,000 from the Texas Education Agency's Governor's fund for private schools in support of our school's dedication to building better, safer, and cleaner facilities.

Besides the physical improvements, we continue to partner with EPISD Private-Non-Profit schools to offer title services to our elementary students. TEA Title grant funding pays for services such as tutoring, acquiring supplemental materials for English learners, acquiring supplemental materials for Science and Reading, and acquiring educational online subscriptions for our computer lab.

We strive for excellence, and we thank you for your continued support!
